



Prescriptive Courses

Apex Learning Comprehensive Courses support programs that are targeted at keeping students who have not earned required course credits on track for graduation. Tightly aligning each item to the standards, the pretests determine an individualized learning plan comprised of the relevant material yet to be mastered.


